**Monthly Meeting for Business:** Muncie Monthly Meeting of Friends met December 15, 2024 to properly transact that business that should come before it. Linda Daniel, acting as Presiding Clerk, opened the meeting with the poem, "A Future Not Our Own" by the Archbishop Oscar Romero of El Salvador. Fourteen persons attended. The minutes of the eleventh month were read and approved after corrections. Next Meeting will be **Sunday, January 19th, 2025 at 9:30 am.** 

**Treasurer's Report:** Carolyn Dowling presented the November balance sheet of the Meeting finances, attached to these minutes. The General Fund is at a negative \$14,308. The Food Pantry Fund has a balance of \$1,922. The Education Fund has a balance of \$474. In an effort to draw interest, money from the Building Fund was transferred to a Money Market Savings account with a current interest rate of 3.10%. The Money Market Savings account has a balance of \$105,089. The CD which draws 4.33% interest has a balance of \$42,331. The Building Fund has a balance of \$23,512; and the Emergency Fund has a balance of \$18,126. The balance of the Emergency Fund includes the negative balance of the General Fund. There was discussion about the net worth of all funds combined. The Building and Emergency Funds are the most liquid accounts that can be used for immediate needs of the Building and the Meeting.

Ministry & Oversight – Changes in Meeting for Worship will be effective the first Sunday of January. The order of worship will be revised. The outline for presiders found in the handbook has also been revised. Please let us know if you are interested in presiding and M&O will guide you through the process. The information cards developed by a past Communication and Publications committee have been repurposed and are now at the entrance of our new worship space M&O will follow up with newcomers as well as prayer concerns. There is also a card that offers suggestions for vocal ministry during open worship. We will continue to discuss how to improve our new worship space. Please pass along any concerns or suggestions to M&O. We will continue to keep a list of Friends in need of visitation and prayer. Follow-up will be in person and/or in written notes. Next committee meeting: Thursday, January 2nd, at 2:00 pm.

Community Outreach- Teri Saxon was nominated to join the Community Outreach Committee. Her nomination was approved. A strategy meeting was held on December 19 to discuss the future of Friends Food Pantry. It was determined that the food pantry will continue in 2025. Adult Sunday School will be finishing "The Secret Message of Jesus" in the next couple weeks. The class has been considering "If the Church were Christian" by Phil Gulley as the next book. The Education Fund is available to purchase books. There was discussion around moving responsibility for decisions about Sunday School material to the M&O committee as it is more in line with the role of M&O.

**Stewardship & Finance** - Jan Scott reported the repairs to the west basement wall were canceled. After prepping the area, the foreman from Indiana Foundation Services expressed concern that digging an internal drain along the wall would compromise the integrity of the wall so he declined to complete the repair. Other options are being considered to address the leak in that area. Matt Weyand Renovations will replace the damaged ceiling tiles in the lobby area. A leak in the East Wing boiler was repaired for \$800. A cool mist humidifier was donated and installed under the piano in the Meeting for Worship room. It is insufficient, and a more specific kind of humidifier may need to be purchased. We are in the process of updating the inspections for the expired permits on the boilers, elevator, and fire alarm(s). A meeting with Sacred Places is scheduled for Tuesday, December 17 to explore what funds are available to us. Next committee meeting: **Tuesday, January 14th, at 2 pm.** 

### **Ad Hoc Building Committee**

The church remains listed for sale at \$350,000. We have had several showings over the last 6 months but no offers for purchase. The last two groups have questioned the listed price given the major repair costs. We need to consider what we are willing to accept as a sale price. A detailed timeline of the showings and other activities of the committee are attached to these minutes in the binder in the front office. Currently, we have two groups expressing serious interest in the building: Fresh Start Family Life & Worship Center of Indianapolis; and Recovery Café of Muncie. Neither has made an offer. Fresh Start has been working at getting estimates from contractors to assess renovation costs. Recovery Café of Muncie has expressed interest in "leasing to own" as they are not currently able to buy and renovate the church. There was a lengthy discussion about the differences between leasing space to outside agencies and "leasing to own". A leasing to own contract would need to be very detailed to protect us, and we will need the guidance of our realtor on how to proceed. Carol Clendening has offered to help us as we explore this as an option. It was requested to arrange a meeting between the Ad Hoc Building Committee and Jason Lipps, our realtor, to determine a path forward with Recovery Café of Muncie. This request was approved. It was requested that Recovery Café of Muncie be informed that we are meeting with our realtor to further discuss a path forward.
